

**Based upon the recommendations and guidelines of the Tri-County Health Department, Northport Schools will restart in person learning for students beginning October 5, 2020.**

On campus school hours for students will be 9:30-12:30 Monday - Friday.

- Elementary students (K-5) will attend classes on campus Monday - Friday.
- Middle School students (6-8) will follow a hybrid schedule of 2 days in person learning on campus and 3 days of online/home learning.
  - Grades 6-7 will attend on Monday and Wednesday.
  - Grade 8 will attend on Tuesday and Thursday (due to a larger class size).
- High School students (9-12) will follow a hybrid schedule of 2 days in person learning on campus and 3 days of online/home learning.
  - Grades 9 and 10 will attend classes on campus Tuesdays and Thursdays.
  - Grades 11 and 12 will attend classes on campus Wednesday and Friday.

ALL students will remain in their grade level cohorts during the day to include recess, breakfast, and lunch.

- Breakfast will be picked up from the cafeteria upon arrival and eaten in the classroom. Lunch will be delivered to their classrooms and eaten in the classroom. Social distancing of at least 6 feet apart will be enforced during breakfast and lunch.
- Students will receive frequent mask breaks.
- Classes may be conducted outside weather permitting with social distancing of at least 6 feet.
- Sharing of materials will be limited between students and only if the item(s) can be cleaned or disinfected easily.
- Cleaning of highly touched areas will be frequent and to fidelity.
- Hand hygiene is imperative and will be frequent.
- Students will be assigned seats in the classrooms.
- Desks/tables will be spaced at least 6 feet apart.
- There will be NO PE classes at this time.

Face coverings will be worn while in the building and outside when 6 feet of physical distancing cannot be obtained.

Busses arrival and departure times are staggered.

Daily screenings will be conducted before students board the bus, or if a walker/car rider upon arrival on campus. If any person has a temperature that registers 100.4 or above, they will be denied access on the bus or campus according to the health guidelines.

Teachers will communicate with their students and parents as to what days and times the student will be on campus, what students will need to bring with them, and what to expect while on campus learning is taking place as well as expectations of home/online learning to continue daily.
